Hire a tux (learn how to knot a tie)

Send invitations

Bachelor's Party
Pay vendors (ensure you have cash on the day)
Distribute wedding timeline
Finalize everything
Get married!



And so it begins...

IDEALLY PLANNING SHOULD START 12 MONTHS IN ADVANCE

12 months out

- Break out the Pinterest Wedding Inspiration board
- Meet with your parents and finalise a budget
- Pick a potential wedding date
- Decide on the vibe you are going for
- Ask your besties to be part of your bridal party
- Draft a guest list
- Visit venues you love as soon as you decide on a fave book it in!! Popular venues can book out 12 months in advance
- Have an engagement party! This one is optional
- Research vendors book a fab photographer, entertainment, celebrant, catering and venue asap - this should be fun!!
- Start the hunt for your wedding dress
- Send a <u>save the date card</u> once all the main vendors are locked in



9 months out

- Order rental items for ceremony and reception, such as chairs, tables
- Order your wedding dress some boutiques require
 6 months to create your dream gown
- Lock in your wedding cake artist
- Meet with florists
- Go shopping with bridesmaids
- Book a honeymoon are your passports in ready to go?

6 months out

- Organise the wedding cars
- Groom: purchase or rent the suits
- The best man/bridesmaids/pals should start planning the hen's night/buck's night
- Choose and order invitations
- Attend pre-wedding counselling catholic weddings
- · Check with your officiate and organise the legalities
- Finalise the menu with caterer
- Travelling overseas? Check on vaccinations
- Organise a trial for hair and makeup why not coordinate this with your pre-wedding photography!
- Gather addresses for invitations
- Choose your cake (yummers!)





3 months out

- Have your <u>pre-wedding portrait session</u> with trial hair and makeup
- Send out invitations
- Attend dress fittings
- Do the boys needs a suit fitting?
- Choose and order wedding bands
- Buy shoes and accessories remember to leave time if ordering online
- Are you going to have gift favours? If so, now's the time to sort these out!
- If you are thinking of doing any DIY start these now



Photography is all about capturing light, the better the light the more beautiful the images, with the best time for portraits being 'golden hour'. If your reception falls in this hour before sunset take ten minutes out of the reception right on sunset - you won't regret it.



1 month out

- Organise any presents you may wish to give on the day
- Are you having a rehearsal or rehearsal dinner?
- Final dress fitting at around 4-6 weeks
- Any last minute adjustments with suppliers
- Finalise run sheet and schedule
- Review RSVP list and call anyone that hasn't replied
- Give the venue/caterer final head count
- Create a table plan/draw up a seating chart
- Song selections to DJ and musicians
- Break in your wedding shoes but keep in mind they will be photographed so try to hold off putting inners in them or scuffing the bottoms too much!
- Make sure the boys know how to knot a tie (or bow tie)
 this will save SOOOO much time when getting ready
- Put together a family shot list for the photographer



Final Week

 Supply venue with a list of supplier requests such as a table for DJ or setup space needed by florist.



- Print place cards
- Contact all wedding suppliers to confirm arrangements - give them an emergency number for the day
- Print off a run sheet with the main suppliers' contact details, for maid of honour and venue
- Get manicure, massage, waxing etc
- Do full wedding dress rehearsal from underwear to veil (make sure your bridesmaids know how to get you into the dress!)
- Have your rings cleaned
- Pack an overnight bag for the reception
- Pack for the honeymoon (passport!!)
- Write your partner a note to be opened on the wedding morning (makes for great photo ops)
- Make last minute changes to table plan if necessary
- Groom: Go for final fitting and pick up your formalwear
- Confirm pick-up times with wedding car company
- Discuss any necessary last-minute substitutions

Let the party begin!!

THE BIG DAY IS FINALLY HERE, RELAX YOU'VE GOT THIS

Night before

- Drop off place cards, table cards, menus, favours, table plan to venue, ensure that the venue knows who to talk to during the reception (hint, it shouldn't be you)
- Sort out payments, ensuring you have some spare cash on the day, for any final balances to be paid (additional hair and make up for example)
- Ensure the cake is on track to be delivered to reception venue - have someone else look after this one!
- Rehearse ceremony with full wedding party + celebrant at the ceremony site
- Ensure that the boys have all their suits, shirts, ties out of their packaging and pressed (check again that they know how to knot a tie!!)
- Does your maid of honour have their <u>emergency</u> <u>bridesmaid kit</u> ready to go?!
- Drink water
- Get a good night's rest!

The morning of

- Eeek!!! It's getting real!!
- Have some breakfast
- Take some time out on your own
- Flowers should be delivered to where the bride is getting ready - buttonholes may need to be taken to the guys
- Don't be tempted to put a bra on the strap marks take hours to disappear
- Groom: give wedding bands to the best man double check before you leave!!
- Take your dress and veil out of the bag early on and have someone steam them if needed
- Lay out all the items (rings, invitations, etc) that you want your photographer to capture, ensure sure that hair and make

up is done by the time the photographer arrives

- Drink more water
- And it's a go!

The day after

- Arrange for someone to return any rentals
- Pre-plan for someone to take the wedding dress and suit for cleaning or return a rented tux to the rental shop
- Write and send thank-you notes to gift-bearing guests and vendors who were especially helpful
- Collect your marriage certificate



Always leave extra time
to get ready, you WILL
run over time and you'll appreciate any
extra down time, and lots of time for
location portraits. Having a stress free
wedding day will lead to beautiful photos.
